


Forthcoming events at the Centre

It is the point where we pause, looking back on the celebrations of Jesus' coming at Christmas and looking forward, moving towards Jesus' passion.


We turn from birth towards death and resurrection.

For many people the ancient icons are a little like Marmite – we either love them or hate them. Perhaps


hate is too strong a word, but in truth we find them hard to understand. They speak a language we do not recognise and so we struggle to interpret them.

During our walk we will discover something of the reality of hardedged love.


We do not promise roses, wine and chocolates. We do offer the opportunity to

Lent course 2023 Wednesdays 9.30 for 10am till 12 Starting 22nd February



This year's Lent course will be led by Rev Jane Winter, using *The Falling of Dusk* by Paul Dominiak.

We are invited to explore the seven last words or phrases of Jesus from the Cross through the experience of doubt, taking us to the heart of the humanity of Jesus' cry: 'My God My God why have you forsaken me?'

Doubt is a very human condition, which can lead us to God through our questioning. It can hone our faith rather than stand against it.

Future sessions are on 1st, 8th, 15th, 22nd and 29thMarch and 5th April. Everyone is welcome to stay for the Eucharist at 12.15pm.
