This May we are looking forward to seeing what grows in larger areas of re-wilding, so don't be surprised if the grass seems long. It is deliberate.




Weekly Wednesday Eucharist

St Benedict and the Holy Spirit Tuesday 9th May 9.30 for 10am till 3pm



Sr Ruth will guide our thinking as we explore the Holy Spirit in the tradition of St Benedict.

This day is part of our series of Benedictine Wisdom days.

On first reading, Benedict appears to make little mention of the Holy Spirit but as we look more deeply into the Rule, we find the Spirit's influence


like a heartbeat regulating the life of the community and filling it with life abundant.

Our day falls in the season of Easter as we prepare for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and think about how the spirit regulates and fills our own lives.

Peace be unto you...seven Resurrection words Wednesdays 9.30 for 10am till 12



Following on from our Lent course exploring the seven last words from the cross, we are offering an Eastertide course focusing on seven words spoken by the risen Jesus.

The words are taken from John's gospel chapters 20 and 21.

We are using insights from Prof. David Ford to guide our thinking.

This course is designed to enable us to explore the meaning of Jesus' word openly with questions and discussion. The course invites us to consider the words of Jesus in the context of resurrection hope.

The sessions run from 10.30 - 12 with coffee at 10am. Participants are welcome to join the Sisters for Sext (12 noon) and join the Centre mid-week Eucharist 12.15.

In this Easter season we reflect with Jesus on his teaching about the land, celebrating a rogation day. Rogation days have fallen out of fashion. They are days in the church's calendar of fasting and prayer in order to seek God's blessing. They take place before major festivals.

Our rogation day walk falls just before Ascension, celebrating


the risen ascended Christ Lord of all time and space. Our focus will be on how we care for the land in the light of Christ's ascension for all time. Bring boots in case it is muddy!
