Thursday 8th September 9.30 till 3pm






Rev'd Harriet Johnson will address the question of how our

The more we read the rule, the more we discover biblical truth hidden in its pages.


During this day, in our series of Benedictine wisdom days, Sr Mary

Rev Martin Henwood invites you to add depth and insight to your understanding of life and the Christian Bible through the playful means of 104 photographic cards and


linked commentaries, biblical verses and prayers.
